A simple guide to using and
maintaining your glass teaware

Teapots & Infuser

Infusers	<p>Coil filters are suitable for use with large leaf teas and flowering teas.</p> <p>Glass and stainless-steel infusers are suitable for smaller leaf teas.</p> <p>It is common for some small sediments to seep through the infuser during steeping.</p>
Cleaning	<p>Clean the teapot before the first use.</p> <p>Coil filters should be removed when cleaning.</p> <p>For spouts and lids, we recommend using a teapot cleaning brush.</p> <p>Teapots can be cleaned in the dishwasher if you place it securely on the top shelf.</p>
Useful Tips	<p>Be aware that the lid can slip off if not held securely in place when pouring the tea.</p>
Microwave & Stovetop	<p>Do not place any metal items in the microwave!</p> <p>Teapots are stovetop safe for gas and electric stoves on low to medium heat only.</p> <p>Not suitable for induction heat stoves!</p>

Double Walled Teaware

<p>Cleaning</p>	<p>Thoroughly rinse the glass with water before first use.</p> <p>The small air-hole at the bottom of the glass is a safety precaution placed to regulate the air pressure between walls.</p> <p>When cleaning the product, avoid abrasive brushing - particularly around the base of the glass.</p> <p>If the rubber seal is damaged, water will be trapped inside the hole and fog will occur between the two walls.</p>
<p>Useful Tips</p>	<p>To avoid fracturing the inner layer, use caution when placing ice into the glass and when using metal spoons.</p> <p>We recommend pouring the liquid first and then adding the ice.</p>
<p>Microwave & Stovetop</p>	<p>Not recommended.</p>

Helpful Tips

Heating Glassware	The glass is less likely to break or shatter if you warm it up gradually. If the ambient temperature in the room is low, warming up the product before use will prolong its life. Avoid resting a hot glass product on cold surfaces.
Handling	Glassware will heat up when you pour in hot water. Please handle the product with care.
